AICTE Signals a New Era for Technical Education as 58 Engineering Colleges Close Nationwide

Quality Takes Centre Stage as Regulators Push for Stronger Institutions

The All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) has approved the progressive closure of 58 engineering and technical institutions across India in 2025–26. More than 950 programmes have also been discontinued.

The move targets institutions that failed to meet academic standards, infrastructure norms, faculty requirements and compliance mandates. Existing students will be allowed to complete their programmes without disruption.

According to AICTE, many of these institutions had struggled for years with low enrolment, inadequate facilities and poor academic outcomes. The regulator has shifted from unchecked expansion to ensuring quality, accountability and sustainability in technical education.

Students today are looking beyond just admissions. They want quality classrooms, modern labs, industry collaboration, research opportunities and strong placement support.

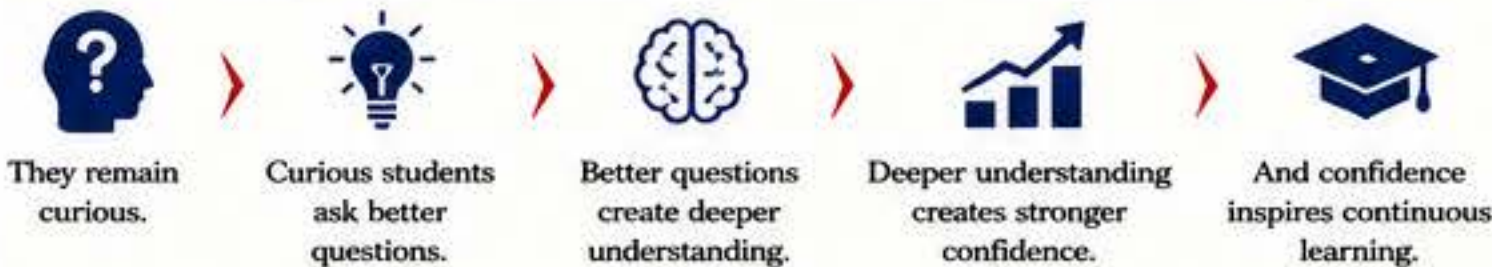
